Supplies



Black, brown or green cardboard, thick paper, or paper glued onto cardboard

Glue - glue stick or PVA glue

Make two different antennae head bands from the instructions below, for dressing up fun, or for a themed party. Make them green for a grasshopper, or make them a dark colour and put lids on the ends to make antennae for a bee, ladybug and other insects.

Get a copy of the 'Bugs and Beetles' issue of the Imagine. Make. Believe children's activity and craft magazine, which is full of ideas for a Bugs and Beetles themed party, including games to play, themed cake, food and recipe ideas, an easy party bag to make, and an invitation or card template to use. It also contains a play and other simple insect dress up ideas, as well as craft activities.

Instructions

- 1. Cut a strip of cardboard or paper 7cm (23/4 inches) wide and as long as possible - up to 60 cm (36 inches). See www.imaginemakebelieve.com/2014/04/how-to-measure-and-cut-astrip-of-paper for instructions on how to measure and cut a strip of paper or card.
- 2. Check to see if the strip is long enough to go around your head, and if not, cut another strip the same width and join the two ends together with glue. Hold the ends together with pegs if necessary, until the glue is dry.








2 bottle lids, approximately 4.1 cm ($1\frac{5}{8}$ inches) in diameter. We used milk or juice bottle lids. Remove disc, then wash and dry lid and disc. See our How to Remove a Milk Bottle Lid Disc page on our website www.imaginemakebelieve.com/howto/milk-lid-disc-removal.

- 3. Wrap the strip around your head and hold the two ends together in the spot they meet and while you are holding the ends together, take it off your head to see where they join. You may need to ask someone to help you, or you may find it easier to do it in front of a mirror.
- 4. Join the two ends by gluing them into position, and hold in place with pegs until the glue is dry.
- 5. On another piece of cardboard or paper, 30 cm (12 inches) long, measure and put a pencil mark at 3 cm (1½ inches) along the short side.
















Insect Antennae Headband - Page 2

- 8. Cut the cardboard or paper along the lines.
- Glue the wide part of the two antennae inside the headband (cardboard loop), and hold in place with pegs until the glue is dry.
- 10. The grasshopper antennae are now complete!



11. To make the bee, ladybug or other insect antennae, glue a milk bottle lid to each point of the antennae and allow to dry.
