
Supplies

Cord, string or thin ribbon



Sometimes you have two ends of cord, string, ribbon, or other material, that need to be tied together. So how do you do it? We show you one of the ways below with one piece of cord.

Instructions




1. Take one end of your cord and place it between your thumb and first finger on the hand you don't write or draw with.




2. Take the other end of your cord with your writing hand, and line it up with the cord end from step 1 as shown, and hold both ends with your thumb and finger.



3. Continue to hold the ends with your thumb and finger, and gently slide both ends of the cord up with your writing hand and wrap them behind and around your first finger.




4. Hold the ends down with your thumb and first finger.






5. While holding the ends with your thumb and finger, carefully slide the loop off the back of your finger with your writing hand.



6. Take ends behind and through the loop with your writing hand, pushing them in with your fingers and pulling them through with your writing hand.



7. Hold the ends with your writing hand and pull gently on the ends while pushing the loop towards the ends with your thumb and finger on your other hand. At the same time, pull downwards on the cord as shown with closed fingers, until knot is tight at the end of the cord.



If you have a knot in the right place, well done! It is a bit tricky, so if it didn't work the first time, try again!
